#### **Additional Support for Learning**

As children grow and develop they may experience difficulties which can result in barriers to their overall wellbeing.

Barriers are varied and can arise from temporary issues to long term medical conditions.

We have a duty and care to support our children to matter what their learning need may be.

# What support is given?

Additional Support for Learning (ASL) can be provided can be provided on four different levels:

- Support will be class based, such as additional resources to support a child experiencing difficulty in understanding a particular aspect of the curriculum. This also includes children who are particularly able and require to be challenged to ensure continuity and progression.
- 2. Support will be within school but extended to include input from an English as an Additional Language (EAL) teacher or time in the Nurture Class La Casa Verde.
- Support will be sought from other education agencies such as Speech and Language Therapy or Sensory Support Service.

4. Support will involve a multi-agency approach and could include health professionals or Social Work.

## **Partnerships**

Parents/carers and education staff at all levels need to work closely together to ensure all children with additional support needs achieve their full potential.

Sacred Heart Primary School aims to ensure:

Our children and families will:-

- Feel confident about the help they are getting
- Understand what is happening and why
- Feel they have been listened to and involved in the decisions affecting them
- Feel the appropriate support was available at the earliest opportunity



## **Pupil Plans**

All children receiving support, whether long term or temporary will have an individual plan devised. The plan will identify both long term and short term targets, the strategies and resources to be used and how we will determine whether or not a child has achieved their targets. Parents/carers and children will be fully involved in identifying and reviewing the targets.

Parents/Carers of children receiving level three or four support will be invited to the school to meet with the Depute Headteacher every six weeks.
